

Minutes of joint meeting of Discipline, Anti-Ragging and  
Anti-Ragging Squad Committee.


Time & Date – 3.30 P.M. on 01/09/2022.

The meeting was held to review the discipline issues/ragging protection etc. following points were discussed:-


1. The committee discussed the progress of the resolutions and tasks finalized in the meeting held on 17/03/2022. This was in the wake of the commencement of offline classes since February 2022. It was found to be satisfactory.
2. In the light of new admission of B.Tech/B. Pharm 1st year the strategies of maintenance of discipline and the measures of stopping and kind of ragging of junior students were also discussed.
3. There are three major categories of the students in the Institute as follows:
  - a. The local students staying with their families
  - b. The outsiders staying in Institute Hostel
  - c. The outsider staying in private hostels, paying guest accommodations, rented flats/houses/rooms etc.

There was a suggestion to frame a committee for redressal of the issues & concern of the students of category (a) and (c). For category (b) students the institute has a council of hostel wardens under the Chief Warden. This suggestion was accepted unanimously and a Students Grievances Redressal Committee (SGRC) is proposed to be constituted.

4. In order to exercise control over the students of Category "C" it was proposed by the Hon. Director to accreditate Private hostels in the closed vicinity of the Institute wherein the students deprived from the Institute hostels will be accommodated with the recommendation of the Institute. On these hostels a Committee of a few faculty members will have a control on issues like ragging on other kind of indiscipline. This model will be implemented from this year.
5. The Director felt a necessity to implement more facilities like dinner facility for day boarders, extension of medical facilities etc. with an idea of maintaining a better environment for students.
6. The promptness of action in case of incidents of ragging or mass discipline was sought to cut further incidents.
