Guide lines

For the teaching and conduct of examination in Autonomous Colleges of DAVV, Indore

- 1. These guide lines will be applicable for teaching and conduct of examination of all regular full-time and part-time undergraduate and post-graduate programmes conducted in the Autonomous College. The regulation will not be applicable to the courses under Distance and Executive programmes.
- 2. The Autonomous Colleges will be responsible for Instituting, Planning, Monitoring, Assessing and modifying their educational programmes. The colleges will take appropriate permissions from competent authorities.
- 3. A semester will consist of 16-18 weeks of academic work. One credit is equivalent to one hour (60 minutes) of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours (120 minutes) of practical work/ field work per week in a semester. The credits associated with the courses will be **valid credits**. The Autonomous Colleges will offer the courses of 20-30 credits for full-time programmes and 12-18 credits for part-time programmes, in a semester.
- 4. The Autonomous Colleges will work out the required minimum number of Credits for the award of the degree on an average, minimum valid 20 credits, per semester for all the programmes, except Honours programmes where required minimum number of credits will be worked out on an average of valid 24-26 credits per semester. The distribution of the credits among theory, practical, field work, project work, etc., in a given semester will also be worked out by the Autonomous Colleges. The total credits in three years pass programme will be 120 credits, while in honours programmes 140 credits.
- 5. (I) The required minimum number of credits for each programme will be distributed among the courses under Core, Ability Enhancement and Skill development, Electives-Discipline Centric and Generic categories.
- (II) The Autonomous Colleges will offer elective-generic courses in each programme to the students. The students will have the choice to opt a course in each semester under elective-generic category available within the Department or in other departments of the college but from the same level of the programmes.
- (III) The requirement of project / dissertation needs to be undertaken by the candidate for the specified credits. Minor project may be offered along with other courses, in any semester should not exceed 4 credits while major project / dissertation should be of maximum of 12 credits in a semester.
- 6. The minimum duration of a programme shall be as per guidelines of the UGC and other statutory bodies like AICTE/ BCI/ NCTE/ PCI etc. The maximum duration of a programme shall be twice of the minimum duration of the programme. For example, two years M.Sc./ M.A./M.Com. programme need to be completed by the student in maximum of four years.
- 7. Requirement of attendance will be as per applicable guidelines of the statutory body / State Government / University.
- 8. Each course will be assessed for 100 marks, out of which 70 marks will be for end-semester examination and 30 marks will be for continuous evaluation. In case of Laboratory / Field /Project work based courses, appropriate distribution of marks will be decided by the college.
- 9. During the semester, a teacher offering the course will do the continuous evaluation of the student at three points of time by conducting three tests of 15 marks each. Of these, two must be written tests and the third may be written test / Quiz / Seminar/ Assignment for theoretical courses. Marks obtained in two best tests out of three will be awarded to the student. In each course, there shall be End Semester Examination of 70 marks. Each student has to appear in at least two tests and End Semester Examination; otherwise, the student will be

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awarded Ab Grade in that course. Total of marks obtained in end-semester examination and best two tests under continuous evaluation will decide the Grade in the course. The Grades obtained in the subjects having practical examination will be shown separately in the Grade sheet / marks sheet.

- 10. The student will be promoted to the next semester if he/ she secure at least 12 valid credits in a semester. In case, the student secures less than 12 valid credits in any semester, then the student will be asked to repeat the entire semester and that semester will be treated as zero semester. Repetition of a theory / practical course is allowed only to those candidates who get F or Ab in the course.
- 11. If a student obtains F or Ab Grade in any course, he /she will be treated to have failed in the course. He / she have to reappear in the examinations of the course as and when conducted. Marks obtained earlier in continuous assessment will be carried forward and added to the marks obtained in repeat end-semester examination to decide the Grade in the repeat course. The theoretical and practical courses can be repeated whenever offered. The student can avail multiple repeat attempts to pass the course.
- 12. On account of valid reasons, a student may withdraw from a semester. In such case the semester will be treated as zero semester. In case of zero semester, the student will not be promoted to the next semester till he/ she clears that semester. The college may allow such a student to register in the subsequent semester whenever it is offered.
- 13. The Autonomous Colleges will decide the ratio for External & Internal evaluation of answer scripts, paper setting and practical examination, as per UGC / Statutory body guidelines.

14. (I) The Grading will be made on 10-point scale as described below:

- (II) In case of B.Ed./M.Ed. / law programmes the students will be promoted as per NCTE/ BCI guidelines.
- (III) In case, statutory bodies of the programme issue guidelines regarding minimum passing percentage of marks, in such cases, for the award of the Grade, marks obtained by the student, in a course are less than the minimum cut-off percentage of marks, then F Grade will be awarded, otherwise the Grades will be awarded as per above mentioned table.
- 15. A student will be eligible for award of a degree when he/ she earns minimum required number of valid credits, within maximum duration of the programme, as specified in the revised ordinance 31, but not before the minimum duration of the programme.
- 16. The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be calculated as weighted average of valid credit points secured by the student. The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off up to 2 decimal places and reported in the Grade sheet / mark sheet.

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17. SGPA is a measure of performance of the student in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester, i.e.

SGPA (Si) =

where Ci is the number of credits of the ith course in a semester and Gi is the Grade point scored by the student in the ith course.

18. CGPA is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all the semesters completed. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all the semesters completed and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters completed, i.e.

$$CGPA = \sum (Ci \times Si) / \sum Ci$$

where Si is the SGPA of the ith semester and Ci is the total number of credits in the ith semester.

19. The conversion of CGPA in to percentage will be as follow to facilitate its application in other academic matters:

Equivalent Percentage = CGPA x10

20. On completing all requirements for award of the degree, the CGPA will be calculated and this value will be indicated on the degree along with Division. The Final degree should also indicate the Division obtained as per follows:

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Definitions of Key Words:

- 1. Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
- 2. Semester: Each semester will consist of 15 18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June.
- 3. Credit Based Semester System (CBSS): Under the CBSS, the equirement for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students.
- 4. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS): The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses under elective category (elective or minor or soft skill courses).
- 5. Programme: An educational programme leading to award of a Degree, diploma or certificate.
- 6. Course: Usually referred to, as 'papers' is a component of a programme.
- All courses need not carry the same weight. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/ tutorials/laboratory work/ field work/ outreach activities/ project work/ vocational training/viva/ seminars/ term papers/assignments/ presentations/ self study etc. or a combination of some of these.
- 7. Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P, F and Ab.
- 8. Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10- point scale.
- 9. Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.
- 10. Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- 11. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- 12. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is theratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.
- 13. Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate: Based on the grades earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester. CGPA will be mentioned in the final semester grade sheet.

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
