NATIONAL CADET CORPS

The National Cadet Corps is the Youth Wing of the Armed Forces with its Headquarters in New Delhi, India. It is open to high school and college students on a voluntary basis.

The National Cadet Corps is a Tri-Serviceorganization, comprising the Army, Navy, and Air Wing, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The National Cadet Corps in India is a voluntary organization that recruits cadets from high schools, colleges, and universities all over India. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades.

The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course. The NCC is the world's largest uniformed youth organization. Its motto is "Unity and Discipline".

The NCC in India was formed by the National Cadet Corps Act of 1948. In 1954, the existing tricolour flag was introduced. The three colours in the flag depict the three services in the Corps; red for the Army, deep blue for the Navy, and light blue for the Air Force. The NCC is headed by a Director General with the rank of Lieutenant General.

The organizational structure continues as follows:

- Directorate-There are 17 directorates located in the state capital, headed by an officer of the rank of a major general from each of the three services.
- Division/Regional Corps-There are three such specialized corps located in Mumbai, Delhi, and Bangalore, respectively. They are independent of the state directorate and report to the HQ. These divisions form the support function of the regular NCC. Each is headed by a Senior Under Officer—an equivalent rank to that of a Lieutenant General.

NCC SGSITS

The NCC was started in SGSITS in 2013 under the 9 MP battalion. In the same year, Lt. Dr. Manish Jaiswal became an Associate NCC Officer. Mr. Nehru Dabar was given the responsibility of Senior Under Officer and he became the first Senior Under Officer of NCC at SGSITS. The NCC was started with a strength of 36 cadets at SGSITS. Currently, it has 106 cadets on roll. NCC SGSITS awards B and C certificates to cadets who successfully complete two and three years of training, respectively, and pass the exam conducted by NCC for each certificate. The cadets of the NCC take part in various events throughout the year organized by the 9 M.P. Battalion. Apart from this, various other activities are organized by the cadets on and off campus.

The flame, which started from Pasighat in <u>Arunachal Pradesh</u>, merged with the main flame before being flagged off.
